



"Starting off with achieving no poverty, we must work to meet our basic need.




Nutritious means healthy and well-balanced.

"It is important to learn how to read and write and how to do math.


All people deserve quality education so that they can succeed on their life path."

Gender-based violence means to be physically cruel to someone just because they are a boy or a girl










In the North, South, East and West, all people of the nation."

Sanitation means living in a clean and healthy way. It also means the right way of getting rid of waste.








"All people should have positive and safe EMPLOYMENT,

Recycle means the process of converting waste materials into reusable objects e.g. we can reuse plastic bags or make toilet paper out of used paper.








Let's reduce MIMIM to prevent temperatures from getting higher."


Pollution is harmful / poisonous substances that are released in the world, into the air, water, ocean etc.












"We must strive for peace, justice and strong INSTITUTIONS. **COURT OF JUSTICE**
